VATICAN PRESS DENIES MOSCOW OVERTURES

ROME, Sept. 8.—Osservatore Romano took today the occasion of polemical argument with the Communist Unita over the fate of Warsaw to deny again that Moscow was seeking an accord with the Vatican. It likewise pointed out that while it had published the charge that the Russians deliberately had halted outside Warsaw to permit patriots to be massacred it also had published full reports on the whole situation from all sources, including Russian.

The Unita used the attack on Osservatore in the Aug. 19 edition of The New Statesman and Nation for what Osservatore called a "maneuver." The British weekly claimed the Russians had halted because they had to and called Osservatore Romano's charge the "usual anti-Soviet maneuvers."

"This is particularly deplorable,"

"This is particularly deplorable," the magazine continued, "at the moment in which Moscow is trying to reach an accord with the Vatican."

Pope Pius, replying to the appeal for Vatican aid from the Polish women of Warsaw, where the underground uprising is now in its sixth week, has sent a message to Wladyslaw Rackewicz, President of the Polish Government-in-Exile, in London expressing the Pontiff's "whole-hearted endorsement" of the appeal, the Polish Telegraph Agency reported yesterday.
