(1) Sketch of the political career of Mr. Lednicki, formerly Polish Minister to Russia, & his policy during the revolution. He was forced into relations with Bolshevik leaders through his official representation of his people at Moscow; but he has always desired friendly relations with the Entente. (2) Two officers of Gen. Pilsudski's staff have testified warmly to the patriotism & capabilities of their leader. General Pilsudski is popular with his men, & will shortly be in command of an army capable of defeating Russian Bolshevism.
