

Sir,

Referring to our conversation of March 10th 1944, during which you were kind enough to offer your valued aid in the procurement of materiel for the Polish Intelligence Service, with special consideration for the needs of our training school - I wish to inform you, that I notified my Headquarters in London to that effect.

According to your suggestion, the necessary requirements will be presented to Col. Bruce in London, whom, I hope you had the opportunity to inform about this matter.

At the same time I wish to extend to you, with a great deal of pleasure, the heartiest thanks for your generous help in the name of my Headquarters. May I assure you Sir, that your aid is greatly appreciated by our Service.

My Headquarters instructed me, to convey to you, our most cordial invitation for a few of your officers to participate in the courses conducted in our Intelligence School. We would be happy to have from one to five men, who should have a knowledge of the Polish language, since the lectures are delivered only in Polish, although the training could be conducted in English.

Each course consists of two semesters, covering three months each. The first is of a general training nature, the other a specializing course.

The second semester of the present course will begin on June 5th. An entirely new course will begin in September. Probably we could hold a special course beginning May 1st, so that your officers would receive a monthly basic training and then could join the regular second semester with the other Polish officers.

In general the regular course is scheduled as follows:


Total of 315 hours in the first semester and 320 hours in the second.

In addition there is one month of parachute practice in the interval during courses /at the present course it will be held in May/.

We would be grateful to you Sir, if you could make your decision as to the course you choose and the candidates you intend to send and inform us at an early date. We would like to have the names of the officers as well, so that we can prepare for their arrival. Your reply may be forwarded directly to Col. Bruce in London or to me.

Following your suggestion, that Lt.Col. Sadowski contact your representatives in Cairo, he has called at your office there, but it appeared that as yet they have not received your instructions.
