Dear Sir,

I am instructed to lay before you the following
resolution passed at our last meeting, March 3rd.

"That this Trades Council & Labour Party representing
5,000 organised workers emphatically protests against
the action of Poland, in invading Russian territory,
and calls on the Polish Government to withdraw its
troops within its own borders.

The Trades Council & Labour Party warns the Polish
Government that if it continues its aggressive policy
towards Russia, the Council and Labour Party will
oppose with every means at its command the sending
of men, munitions, or money to the aid of Poland.

Further as an integral part of the Labour Movement, this
Trades Council and Labour Party will use every means
as well as its influence of any commitments entered
into between the British and Polish Government at the
expense of Russia".

attention, and communicate the same to your Government,
